The President informed the Board, that the Rev Dr Savage, Missionary to Africa had departed for that country.

The President communicated to the Board the fact, of the death of Dr Philip P. Rückel, a member of the Board, and one of the delegates from St John's Chapel, who accompanied the communication with appropriate and expressive remarks, on the deeply interesting circumstances of his departure in the confidence of a certain faith. Whereupon on motion it was,

"Resolved - That the Board express their deep emotion, at the melancholy intelligence of the sudden demise of our esteemed associate; and that we do also, with great satisfaction and devout thanksgiving, reflect on our friend's rare calmness, on the near approach of death, and his humble resignation to the will of God, a well grounded hope of acceptance in the Beloved, and triumphal longing to depart and be with Christ."

"Resolved - that we will ever hold in grateful recollection the part which he took in the organization of our Society, and the deep interest which he

" manifested in the transactions of our Board and operations of the Society; and that we will ever cherish the remembrance of his endearing qualities as a man and of his exemplary virtues as a Christian."

"Resolved - That a copy of the Resolutions be transmitted to the bereaved & mourning family of which our late associate was a member, accompanied with a suitable expression of our sympathy and condolence."

"Resolved - That copies be sent to Doct<sup>r</sup> Brinckerhoff, our friend's constant & faithful companion in his last illness, and to the kind family of Mr Goddard, near Ottawa in Illinois, at whose house Dr Ruckel passed the closing hours of his life; and we add, the assurance of our gratitude for the many attentions shown to him by those who ministered to his wants, and especially for their pious solicitude in affording him every spiritual consolation."
