The meeting was opened with Prayers

The minutes of the meetings held in July and August were both read and on motion approved.

The Treasurer presented his usual monthly report showing payment for the month \$547⁸⁷ Receipts \$231⁹¹ and Balance from previous report \$222²⁸ leaving balance due the Treasurer of \$323⁶⁸

Mr Whitlock reported from the Superintending Com^{tee} of Ch of Our Saviour that they had been served with a notice from the Dock Commissioners directing the removal of the Chapel - but that it had been subsequently withdrawn.

expected - therefore Resolved that a

Committee of seven be appointed to consider and report, after thorough examination, upon the subject, with such recommendations as in their judgment may be deemed desirable as likely to promote greater efficiency in this most important portion of the field committed to our care.

The motion was seconded and adopted unanimously.

On motion the Chair was requested to appoint the Committee and thereupon appointed as such Committee Misses Whitlock - Ely - Shortridge - Bundett - Canning - Marshall and Hubbard. Mr Ely desired to be excused on account of engagements which would prevent his attending to the business of the Comt. when he was excused - and on motion the Chairman of the meeting was added to the Committee. and the Committee were requested to report at the next meeting of the Board.

Present m^rs Danforth, Cummings, Whitlock, Duncan, H Rogers, Kummel, Ward, Marshall, Tracy, Thorp, Ruckel, Mitchell, Burdett, J^d. Morgan, B^t. Rogers, Hubbard, Shortridge, Ivey, Cuming, Morris, Peet, Baget & Collingwood and Rev^t m^rs Roberts & Wacke. Missionary excuse was offered for Mr Richards.

The meeting was opened with Prayer by Rev^t Mr Roberts.

The minutes of meetings held on 10th Oct^o and 14th Inst were read. On motion approved

The Treasurer presented his report dated to 14th Inst. Showing Payments for the month \$ 902³² Receipts \$ 1405⁹⁰ overdraft at date of previous report \$ 589⁹⁰ overdrawn at date of this report \$ 86³²

M^r H Rogers on behalf of Superintending Committee of Ch^t of the Holy Comforter reported that they had examined Voucher'd bills for Coal & other supplies am'tg to \$ 27⁵² and for Expenses fitting up the new room am'tg to \$ 124⁴⁸ but that there were other bills not yet presented to a moderate am't for the same purpose tasked that appropriation

be made to cover these amts when on motion it was resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to pay from the Disposable Fund the amt named £27⁵³ for supplies - and from the Permanent Fund - such bills as may be audited by the Comt for fitting up the premises. not exceeding £1000. in all,

On motion the Secretary was authorized to sign a lease of the premises for the use of the North River Mission for five years from 1st May last at £700. per ann: Rent to commence from 1st Aug^t & to affix the Seal of the Society thereto.

Mr Burdett Ch^r of Comt on the Home. read the usual monthly report.

Mr Mitchell Ch^r of Visiting Comt of Ch: of Our Saviour. and Mr Canning Ch^r of Visiting Comt Ch: of the Holy Comforter, read their reports. the latter calling attention of Members of the Board. to the frequent disregard of their appointment as visitors evinced by their non attendance.

Mr B T Rogers read from the Record of Open air services at Coopers Slip,

Mr Jas D Morgan Ch^r of the Comt of Miss^s Means presented a report on the subject referred to them in May last recommending that the salaries of the missionaries remain as at present viz £1000. per ann

and that steps be taken to insure a more
thorough general response from the Churches
in the day of Collections in aid of the Society.

Rev^{ds} Miss Roberts and Walker
read their usual monthly reports.

Mr Whitlock Ch^m of the Special
Com^{te} appointed to enquire into the condition
of the work of the Society at the East River
Station, presented their report, accompanied
by the resignation of Rev^t Mr Lewis as a
missionary of this Society, - recommending
that the resignation of Rev^t Mr Lewis be
accepted to take effect at as early a date
as may appear to be consistent with the
relations heretofore existing between him
& the Society, & that the Bible Class and
Sunday School be revived, as soon as prac-
ticable & asking for the earnest & hearty coope-
ration of the Superintending Com^{te} & the Member
of the Board generally in an effort for the
more vigorous prosecution of the work of
the Society at that Station. On motion
the report of the Com^{te} was accepted and
the Com^{te} discharged.

Mr Cummings moved that the
resignation of Rev^t Mr Lewis be accepted
to take effect on 1st Jan^y next, which
was seconded by Mr Canning. Mr Marshall
then moved as an amendment that the

resignation of Rev. Mr Lewis be accepted without fixing any date when it shall take effect, which was seconded by Mr Tracy - and after discussion Mr Cummings withdrew his motion and the resolution offered by Mr Marshall was put and carried, unanimously - as follows viz: Resolved, That the resignation of Rev. Robert W Lewis as one of the missionaries of this Society, now presented to the Board, and dated 18th October 1871, be accepted, and that the Secretary be directed to notify Rev. Mr Lewis of this action of the Board.

On motion of Mr Tracy it was then further Resolved, That the Rev. Mr Lewis be requested to continue in charge of the Mission at the East River Station & in the occupancy of the Mission House until 1st February next, if convenient to himself so to do, at the same rate of compensation as heretofore.

Mr Cummings presented copies of certain publications - the plates of which are in possession of Miss Pott Young & C^o; and copies for distribution could be had at small expense. Moved that they be referred to the Book Com^te with power to have printed such number as they may deem advisable, which was adopted.

On motion of Mr Marshall it was resolved, that a Committee of five be appointed to procure a suitable person to take charge of the Mission at the East River Station. It was also further resolved that the Com^t be appointed by the Chairman.

Mr Cummings announced to the Board that the Lady who formerly had charge of the Bible Class at the East River Station, would resume it as soon as notice could be given to that effect.

The recommendations of the ~~spec~~ report of the special Com^t on the East River Station were referred to the Superintending Com^t of that Station.

The attention of the Book Com^t was called to the wants of all the stations of the Society, of Books for distribution. Miss H Rogers, Bogart and Cummings volunteered to attend the open air services.

Mr Hubbard presented a Report from the Superintending Com^{tee} of the Ch: of Our Saviour, stating that the work at that station was progressing satisfactorily the Bible Class had been resumed - and the first of a course of lay-lectures at the Mission House had been delivered by Mr Collingwood, a member of the Com^{tee} tasked for an appropriation of \$34⁰⁵ to pay sundry bills of repairs & supplies acknowledging donations of Books from the B & C P Book So: Church Book So: & a friend of Rev^d D^r Coake.

Mr H Rogers made a verbal report on behalf of Superintending Com^{tee} Ch: of the Holy Comforter tasked for the usual appropriation for Xmas greens when on motion it was resolved that \$10 be appropriated for Xmas greens for each of the Chapels.

Mr Buckitt Ch^r of Com^{tee} on the Home presented the usual monthly report and also a communication from Mr Blake asking to be relieved from the position of Superintendent of the Home by next Spring.

Mr Bogart presented the Report of Visiting Com^{tee} of Ch: of Our Saviour & the Reg^d Sec: read the Report of m^{rs} Chapman

Ch^r of Visiting Com^t of Ch. of the Holy Comforter,
 Rev^r Mr. Roberts presented his

 app^r as such Com^t with full powers as aforesaid.

Mr Marshall presented a communication from Rev^r Dr Dyer, advising the Board of a donation to the Society by Mr W Astor Esq of \$1800 per annum: setting forth the terms & conditions upon which the donation is made & making sundry suggestions in connection therewith. Announced further that, having been satisfied that informed that no formal or official acknowledgement was desired by the donor, he had acknowledged receipt of the communication & expressed what he would believe would be the sentiments of the Board in regard to it. When on motion of Mr Oakley it was resolved, That the letter of Dr Dyer be entered at length upon the minutes & that the action of Mr Marshall in replying to it, be approved.
