I find myself at a loss for words to express how this tribute of respect & Christian love, have moved me, while I assure the Board that my fervent prayer has always been that I might never presume to arrogate to myself any merit or credit for any good that Our Heavenly Father might lead me to attempt but thankfully ascribe the Honor & Glory to Him who blessed the effort, yet I must confess that this honor so kindly & gratin'ously offered has touched me deeply - My hopes have even been to look for reward from a higher source than man, therefore I believe I never at any time wrought to be seen of men - but that I should be so honored in my old age has deeply affected me & I beg of the Com<sup>tee</sup> to assure the Members of the Board of Managers I fully appreciate this kind Memorial - My heart rejoices to find that our religious effort began with so much anxiety, Prayer has been so abundantly successful that the Society from being but a doubtful experiment at the beginning has attained such extensive proportions - I never doubted its success eventually for I had already had some experience in introducing religious worship on shipboard & I

only wish I had the physical ability to relate to the Board some of my experience. But I find myself unable to write them out from my age & infirmities. I can scarce hope ever to be able to meet with the Board again. but they have my earnest sympathizing prayers for their future continued success - with heartfelt brotherly love for them individually I feel it a privilege to sign myself, Respect g. your Brother
