of said Superintending Committee immediately after their election, to hold a meeting for organization, by appointment of Secretary, whose duty it shall be to keep a record of the business of their respective Committees to certify all bills audited by them, and hand the same to the Speaker preceding the next succeeding meeting of the Board.

There shall be at least one meeting in each month of said Committees, four of the members with the Missionary, or in case of his absence, five members constituting a "quorum"
